UG & PG Programmes Refund Policy (2026–27)

This policy outlines the conditions, timelines, and procedures governing the refund of fees for students admitted to Undergraduate (UG) and Postgraduate (PG) programmes at the South Asian University (SAU) for the Academic Year 2026–27.

Candidates seeking to withdraw their admission must submit a request through the Refund Form available on the Candidates' dashboard in the SAU admission Portal.

Refund Structure

The refund of fee shall be governed by the following conditions:

Scenario with Timeline	Refund Entitlement	Non-Refundable Components
Withdrawal 7 or more days before the commencement of the Monsoon Semester	100% of the Semester Fee, Security Deposit, Hostel Fee & Student Aid Fund	Admission Fee
Withdrawal less than 7 days before the commencement of the monsoon semester	75% Semester Fee, Security Deposit, Hostel Fee & Student Aid Fund	Admission Fee
Withdrawal within 15 days of the commencement of the Monsoon Semester	50% of Semester Fee + 75% of Security Deposit	Admission Fee + Hostel Fee + Student Aid Fund
Withdrawal after 15 days of the commencement of the Monsoon Semester	75% of Security Deposit	Admission Fee + Semester Fee + Hostel Fee + Student Aid Fund
Conditional admission (pending declaration of results) - eligibility not met after the declaration of qualifying examination results	100% of Semester Fee + 75% of Security Deposit	Admission Fee + Hostel Fee + Student Aid Fund

Processing of Refunds

Refunds will be initiated one month after the commencement of the Monsoon Semester. The amount is expected to be refunded within two months from the start of the academic session. Applicants are advised not to send queries regarding refund status during this processing period. No interim queries will be answered.

General Provisions

- The refund policy shall be applicable irrespective of the date on which admission has been offered.
- As SAU is an international university, the regulations/guidelines pertaining to admissions and refunds of the governments of any SAARC member state are not applicable to it.
